## PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT DISCUSSIONS TO HAVE WITH 2/1 PARTNERS by Maritha

A. After a 2 over 1 response to your major opening, which is your default bid:

1) Rebid of the major DENIES stoppers in all unbid suits (but might have only 5 in major)
2) Rebid of 2NT shows balanced hand, does NOT promise stoppers perse and DENIES 6 of your major.
3) Example: 1H-P-2C-P-2H OR 2NT
B. After a 2 over 1 response to your major, a SINGLE jump is:
4) SPLINTER in support of suit bid by Responder (recommended)
5) Second 5-card suit and slam interest.

Example: 1S-P-2C-P-3H
C. With inverted minors, a SINGLE raise (e.g., 1D-P-2D) by an UNPASSED hand shows:

1) 11 or more HCP (or a FABULOUS 10) and is forcing to 2 NT or 3 of minor (recommended)
2) Game Force (with jump in other minor showing Limit Raise)
D. Jump Shifts over Major Openings are:
3) Mini Splinters (recommended)
4) Bergen Raises
5) Flower Bids (Fit Showing Jumps)
6) Weak jump shifts
E. Jump Shifts over Minor Openings are:
7) Weak if a major, e.g., 1D-P-2H OR 2 S or if 2 D over 1C. (Recommended)
8) Splinter bids
9) Limit Raise (criss-cross) if in other minor
F. Problem hand of 6-card club suit with 11-12 HCP when partner opens 1D.
10) Treat 1D-P-3C as invitational
11) Bid and rebid clubs and treat it as non-forcing, e.g., 1D-P-2C-2NT-3C
G. Decide whether you want High Level Reverses (at 3 Level) to show extras (at least a King)
12) High Level reverses show at least a King Extra, e.g., 1S-P-2C-P-3C
13) High Level reverses are just shape showing, e.g, 1S-P-2D-P-3C
14) Raises of partner's minor show extras in either HCP or distribution, e.g., 1S-P-2D-P-3D.
15) Recommended that after a 1 H opening and $2 / 1$ in minor, 2 S does NOT show extras, just shape showing (COULD have extras, but not guaranteed)
H. Decide type of Game Tries you are using after 1 of major and single raise to 2 .
16) Help Suit Game Tries (Recommended at the moment)
17) Short Suit Game Tries
18) Kokish Game Tries
I. Discuss whether you are using Constructive Raises (1M-P-2M guarantees 8-10 HCP) or not. J. You have made the agreements that (after suit agreement) cue bids BELOW 4NT can show FIRST or SECOND round control (Aces/voids or Kings/singletons) so always bid what is cheapest. Skipping a suit DENIES both $1^{\text {st }}$ and $2^{\text {nd }}$ round control (and may put slam out of the picture).
