This is a New Minor Forcing bid. East wants to find out if West has 3 hearts (or 4 spades). It should be marked on the E/W convention card and should be alerted.

When West bid 3H West showed 3 hearts. If West did not have 3 hearts or 4 spades, West would bid 3NT and East would pass.

If West had 4 spades and bid 3S, most Easts would bid 3NT.

4H looks beatable. The defense gets 2 hearts, a diamond and a club This frequently happens when there is a duplication of values. That's what E/W have in spades. They have the top 4 spades, but they only get 3 tricks.

Declarer's chance is to end play North in clubs. Strip the hand of spades and diamonds, and throw North in with North's last heart.
