A classic unblocking play to make my contract.


W 2S (weak)

N 3D (Good 5+ card diamond suit and an opener)

S 3NT (We're going to game with this hand opposite an opener and it's not going to be in diamonds or spades. Notrump looks like the place)

West leads a heart to the Queen.


East returns a spade to the Queen.


East returns a heart to the Ace.


East returns a heart to the King.


My only chance to make this is to set up the diamonds, otherwise I have too many spade losers.
I could play a diamond to the Queen and a club to the King and hope the Queen of diamonds is doubleton and will drop under the ace. That'll work about $1 / 3$ of the time.

I have a better play though.

I can play West for the Queen of diamonds. If East has it, I know East has no more hearts to play and I'm home. That's about a $50 \%$ shot.

So, I play the ace of diamonds to unblock my king and then play the Jack of diamonds to West's Queen giving the defense its 4th and last trick.


West returns the 9 of spades, but it doesn't matter. Dummy is good when I pitch the losing club on the ace of spades.
