Don't pull trump when you need them to ruff losers.


S 1D (Could have opened 2NT (20-21 points and flat), I have $19 \mathrm{hcp}+1$ for the 3 aces +1 for the 2 AQ combinations $=21$. I would usually open this 2 NT. But since I was already winning the game, I went with what the field would do.)

N 1S

S 4S (This is not a shut-out bid. It shows 19-21 points and 4 spades)
Passed out.

East led the Jack of clubs and all the club honors came down,


The key to this hand is not to pull any trump. There are 3 diamonds I need to ruff. I can't afford to play a trump as the defense can play a second trump when they get in with 10 of clubs, as that would
only leave me with 2 trumps in dummy to ruff with.

I hope to take:
4 spades in my hand
3 diamond ruffs in dummy
2 hearts if the heart finesse works, it does
1 club
10 total tricks

Turns out I take 11 tricks when everything goes smoothly and I end up with this position at trick 9. The defense has only taken one trick, the ace of clubs to this point.


I lead the Jack of diamonds, and when West fails to cover, I pitch the 8 of hearts (a loser on a loser).
East ruffs,


East returns the King of hearts, ruffed by West and over ruffed with the King,


When I play a spade back to my hand, the J 10 fall under the AQ, making the 11th trick.
